
## South Newcastle Federation Autumn Term 2013

Both schools have very positive and ambitious plans to move from a grading of Good by Ofsted (NCHS was graded Good in March 2012, Clayton Hall in June 2013) to Outstanding. We would like you to join us and allow us to give your child the right balance of challenge and enjoyment.

May I wish you and your child every success in the coming term and we look forward to working with our partner primary schools during the year.

The new school year started with drama in the science department at NCHS.


The coffee money had disappeared and our Year 6 scientists were called in to solve the mystery.....





Using microscopes to study clothing fibres left at the scene, chromatography to decide which pen was used, fingerprint analysis, blood group type testing and even a grand finale of flame testing, pupils from St Giles' & St George's, Knutton St Mary's, Westlands, St Luke's, Silverdale and Friarswood Primary Schools showed forensic skills to rival the best CSI's as they analysed the available evidence to get to the truth of the disappearing money.





Teams from each school worked together to piece together the clues and decide which pieces of evidence they should use when coming to their conclusions. Everyone had a wonderful time, especially when the NCHS science staff were subjected to some very difficult questioning by the young detectives!
